

# Hunslet sign top youngster

Struggling Hunslet have beaten Castleford and Featherstone Rovers for the signature of 16-year-old off-half Robert Gaitley, from Townville Juniors.

Gaitley, who captained the Castleford Inter-Town team, is regarded as one of the best prospects in the county and to sign him Hunslet have paid well over the normal figure for a young player.

However, he will not be rushed into senior football, and the club have said they will allow him to continue playing for Townville, who are one of the top under-17 sides this season.

Spectators for Hunslet's "A" team game with Dewsbury "A" at Parkside tomorrow will be admitted.

Some form of collection will be taken.

The decision to allow free admission has been made because five previous "A" team games produced total receipts of only £28. The collection team is already in use by a number of clubs for reserve games.
